Climate	<i>The weather conditions in an area.</i>
Environment	<i>The surroundings that a person or animal lives.</i>
Igloo	<i>A dome shaped shelter built from ice.</i>
Inuit people	<i>A group of people that live in the areas of the Arctic</i>
North Pole	<i>The most northerly point on Earth</i>
South Pole	<i>The most southerly point on Earth</i>
