Key Facts

- About 2% of the Earth contains rainforests. (This is 8% of the Earth's land!)
- About 50% of all the Earth's animals live in rainforests.
- The Amazon rainforest is the largest rainforest in the world.
- A lot of our oxygen supply comes from rainforests.
- Rainforests are located in 6 of the 7 world's contents.
